

NOTICE TO VOTERS OF DATE AFTER WHICH NO ARGUMENTS
FOR OR AGAINST A CITY MEASURE
MAY BE SUBMITTED TO THE CITY CLERK

NOTICE IS GIVEN that the General Municipal Election is to be held in the City of Upland on November 3, 2026, at which time there will be submitted to the voters the following measure:

“Upland Business License Reform Measure To modernize City of Upland’s 31-year-old business license tax, with no tax increase to residents, lowering taxes on most small businesses, and ensuring large businesses pay their fair share for general city services such as: fixing potholes/streets; repairing infrastructure; and 9-1-1 response, shall the measure with rates between 0.065% and 0.2% of gross receipts, generating \$3.3 million in local funds until ended by voters, and requiring independent audits, be adopted?”	Yes

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that pursuant to Article 4, Chapter 3, Division 9 of the Elections Code of the State of California, the legislative body of the City, or any member or members thereof authorized by the body, or any individual voter or bona fide association of citizens, or any combination of voters and associations, may file a written argument titled either “Argument in Favor of Measure __” or “Argument Against Measure __”, not to exceed 300 words in length, accompanied by the printed name(s) and signature(s) of the author(s) submitting it, or if submitted on behalf of an organization, the name of the organization, and the printed name and signature of at least one of its principal officers who is the author of the argument, for or against the City measure.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that, based upon the time reasonably necessary to prepare and print arguments and sample ballots for the election, the City Clerk has fixed, **Monday, August 17, 2026, at 12:00 p.m.**, as the date after which no arguments for or against the City measure may be submitted to the clerk for printing and distribution to the voters as provided in Article 4. Arguments shall be submitted to the City Clerk, accompanied by the printed name(s) and signature(s) of the author(s) submitting it, or if submitted on behalf of an organization, the name of the organization, and the printed name and signature of at least one of its principal officers who is the author of the argument, in accordance with Article 4, Chapter 3, Division 9 of the Elections Code of the State of California, at the City Hall of the City of Upland, California. Arguments may be changed or withdrawn until and including the date fixed by the City Clerk.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that that if direct arguments are filed, rebuttal arguments titled either “Rebuttal to Argument in Favor of Measure _____” or “Rebuttal to Argument Against Measure _____”, not to exceed 250 words in length, may be submitted by the authors of opposing direct arguments, and filed with the

clerk, accompanied by the printed name(s) and signature(s) of the author(s) submitted it, or if submitted on behalf of an organization, the name of the organization, and the printed name and signature of at least one of its principal officers who is the author of the argument. The rebuttal arguments shall be filed with the City Clerk not later than **Thursday, August 20, 2026, at 5:00 p.m.** Rebuttal arguments shall be printed in the same manner as the primary arguments. Each rebuttal argument shall immediately follow the primary argument which it seeks to rebut.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN if more than one argument for or more than one argument against any City measure is submitted, the City Clerk shall select one of the arguments in favor and one argument against the measure, as set forth in Elections Code section 9287.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that any proposed ordinance, ballot question, impartial analysis, or direct argument filed under the authority of the Elections Code will be available for public examination in the Clerk's office for 10-calendar days following the deadline for filing arguments and analysis(es). Any rebuttal argument filed under the authority of the Elections Code will be available for public examination in the Clerk's office for not less than 10-calendar days from the deadline for filing rebuttal arguments.
