# Redistricting Process

Step	Description
Initial Pre-Draft Hearing(s) <b>September 13<sup>th</sup> and October 25<sup>th</sup></b>	Held prior to release of draft maps. Education and to solicit input on the communities in the City. Identify “neighborhoods,” “communities of interest,” and “secondary areas.”
Initial deadline for draft maps	Deadline for the public to submit draft maps for inclusion in the next hearing packet and presentation
Release draft maps	Draft maps posted to project website
Two hearings on draft maps <b>January 10<sup>th</sup> and February 14<sup>th</sup></b>	Two meetings to discuss and revise the draft maps and to discuss the election sequence.
Map adoption <b>February 28<sup>th</sup></b>	Map adopted via ordinance/resolution. Final map must be posted at least 3/7 days prior to adoption.

# Redistricting Rules and Goals

## 1. Federal Laws

- Equal Population
- Federal Voting Rights Act
- No Racial Gerrymandering



## 2. California Criteria for Cities

1. **Geographically contiguous**
2. **Undivided neighborhoods and “communities of interest”**  
(Socio-economic geographic areas that should be kept together)
3. **Easily identifiable boundaries**
4. **Compact**  
(Do not bypass one group of people to get to a more distant group of people)

### ***Prohibited:***

*“Shall not favor or discriminate against a political party.”*

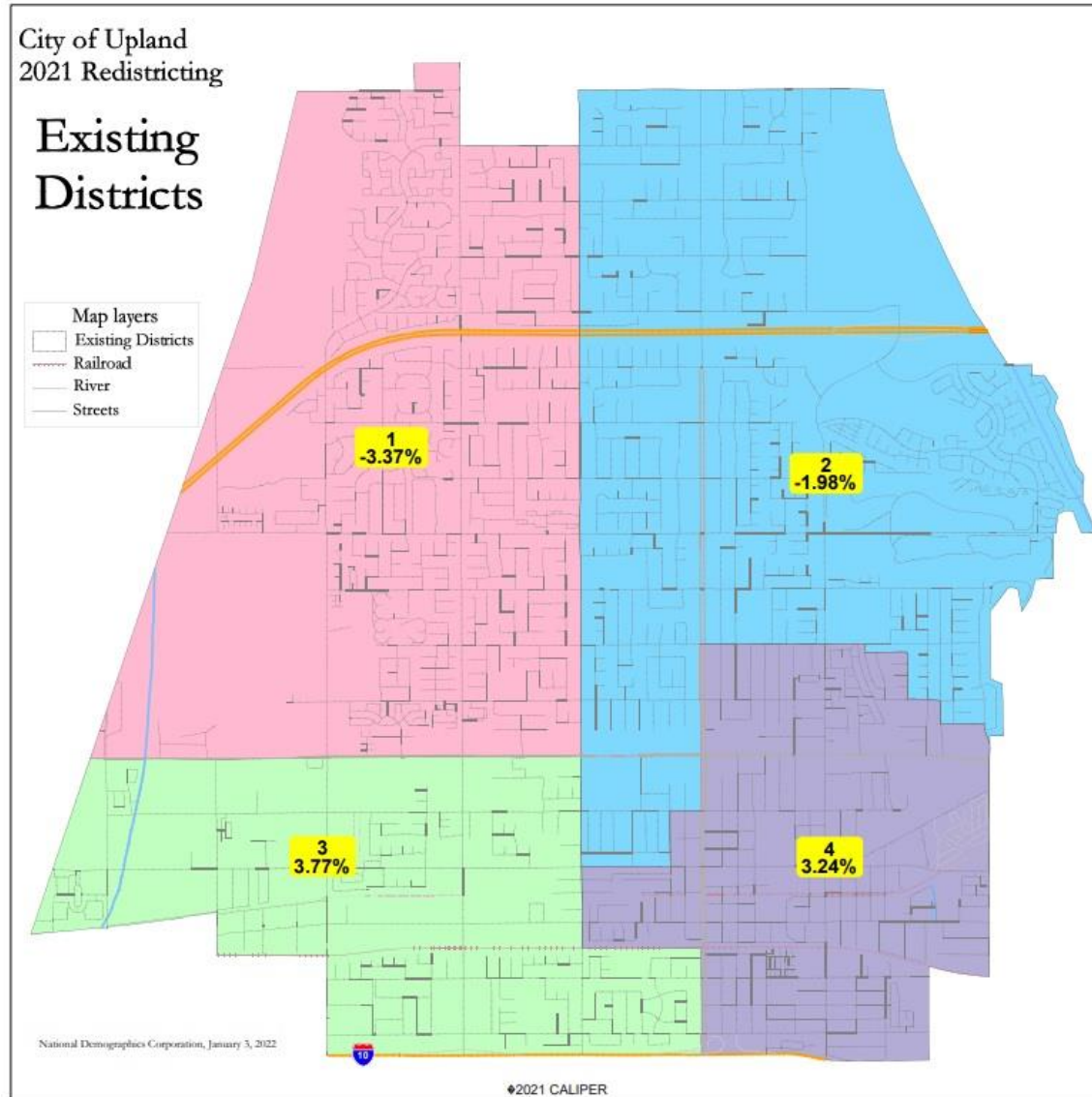
## 3. Other Traditional Redistricting Principles

- Minimize voters shifted to different election years
- Respect voters’ choices / continuity in office
- Future population growth
- Preserving the core of existing districts

# Upland's Current Districts are Population Balanced

---

- ❑ Upland's existing districts are population balanced using the 2020 Census data
- ❑ In addition, current districts are reasonably compact
- ❑ Upland City Council can give direction at this hearing:
  - ❑ Continue redistricting process to consider changes to neighborhoods and communities of interest (if any) and refine the current district lines? OR
  - ❑ Keep the current districts as-is
- ❑ Regardless of the Decision: Upland must still hold the four required hearings and pass an ordinance to adopt district boundaries (either current or changed) by April 17<sup>th</sup>

# Timeline & Next Steps

Fall 2021	Mapping software released to the public.
September 13, 2021	1 <sup>st</sup> Public Hearing Held prior to the release of draft maps
Fall 2021	Redistricting data available. Census data released August 12 <sup>th</sup> . California released prisoner-adjusted redistricting data on September 27 <sup>th</sup> .
October 25, 2021	2 <sup>nd</sup> Public Hearing to identify “neighborhoods” and “communities of interest.” Mapping tools overview.
December 7, 2021	Community Workshop
January 10, 2022	3 <sup>rd</sup> hearing to review draft maps and received direction from Council
February 7, 2022	Publish revised maps
February 14, 2022	Proposed 4 <sup>th</sup> hearing and first reading of the adoption ordinance
February 28, 2022	Final Hearing and Council to adopt District map. Must be completed no later than April 17, 2022
April 17, 2022 (E-205)	City deadline to adopt and submit map to Registrar
November 2022	2022 Election
